ADDENDUM NO. 2, RFQ-2022-1
June 17, 2022

This addendum is issued in response to questions received by GCPD as related to RFQ-2022-1 for Interim Program Management and Engineering Services. Offerors are further notified of a revised deadline for response submittal as stated below.

- Q1: Regarding the requirement for the primary lead to be a Professional Engineer licensed in the state of Texas as described under Sec II, A.1. If the primary lead is registered in another state but can get a Texas PE license through reciprocity, would the Texas PE license qualification be met if the primary lead's license application is in process, but pending at the time the proposal submittal?
- A1: No. The primary lead for this project must hold either a valid Texas Professional Engineering license or a valid Project Management Professional certificate at the time of submittal of the Statement of Qualifications as specified in the RFQ and further clarified by Addendum 1, dated June 9, 2022.
- Q2: Request for extension for submission of the responses to the Request for Qualifications (RFQ-2022-1).
- A2: Deadline for submission of responses to the Request for Qualifications for Interim Program Management and Engineering Services is hereby revised to 5:00 pm CDT on Tuesday, July 5, 2022.
- Q3: Item # 1.D. of the RFQ (page 5/22) indicates the contractor will "oversee work performed by USACE, third-party project delivery engineering firms or other State Agencies or local governmental entities under agreement with the GCPD." Considering this requirement:
- A) Can GCPD confirm that any firm (prime and/or sub) currently under contract with USACE Galveston District, Jefferson County DD7, and/or Orange County Drainage District on the Sabine Pass to Galveston (S2G) projects are deemed conflicted to submit on this RFQ?
 - B) Galveston District has projected to issue large A-E MATOCs in the near future for potential work on Coastal Study Projects. Does GCPD deem submittal on this RFQ as potential conflict for any future work opportunities with the USACE Galveston District on the Coastal Study projects?
- A3: Based on the information provided and/or information otherwise available, GCPD cannot determine the existence of conflicts of interest at this time. Offerors are encouraged to independently evaluate potential conflicts interests prior to submitting a response to this RFQ.

- Q4: Given that the scope of the selected consultant will include oversight of work “performed by the USACE, third-party project delivery engineering firms or other State Agencies or local governmental entities under agreement with the GCPD”, will firms that are currently working on the Orange County project or Port Arthur project be precluded from pursuing this solicitation?
- A4: Based on the information provided and/or information otherwise available, GCPD cannot determine the existence of conflicts of interest at this time. Offerors are encouraged to independently evaluate potential conflicts interests prior to submitting a response to this RFQ.
- Q5: Will the selected consultant be restricted from pursuing future work related to the Coastal Barrier project for the USACE or any other state agencies or local government entities?
- A5: Based on the information provided and/or information otherwise available, GCPD cannot determine the existence of conflicts of interest at this time. Offerors are encouraged to independently evaluate potential conflicts interests prior to submitting a response to this RFQ.
- Q6: Could GCPD provide copies of any executed agreements and any associated amendments between GCPD and Orange Co, Jefferson Co and GLO?
- A6: The only executed agreements that are responsive to this request are 1) The Interlocal Agreement between the GCPD and Orange County/Orange County Drainage District, and 2) The Local Cooperation Agreement between the GCPD and the Texas General Land Office. Both of these documents are available to the public on the GCPD website.
- Q7: Can a cover and section divider tabs be included, separate from the page count?
- A7: A cover and section divider tabs can be excluded from the page count provided these pages do not include any photos, images, or other text beyond the offeror’s name and project title on the cover and identification of the upcoming section on divider pages.
- Q8: Introductory Letter: Is the introductory letter included in the 25-page limit?
- A8: Yes, ALL pages of the submittal, including the cover letter will count toward the 25-page limit, with the exception of a cover and section divider tabs as explained in the above Q7/A7.
- Q9: Per RFQ page 10: “Please submit one (1) emailed copy to nicole.sunstrum@gcpdtexas.com and fifteen (15) hard copies [...] If original is in color, please submit the copies in color and mark “Copy””. Can you please clarify if you would like all 15 hard copies marked with “copy”? Are wet signatures required for an original copy?
- A9: Regarding the paper submissions: Please provide 1 bound original with wet signatures and 14 additional copies, each marked “COPY” on the cover, for a total of 15 bound paper submissions.

In addition to the above questions and responses, all offerors are herein notified that the deadline for submissions, as stated in the RFQ cover letter and in Paragraph VI.A is hereby revised:

Statements of Qualifications must be received by the District no later than Tuesday, July 5, 2022, by 5:00 pm CDT.
